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Neuroscience and the Unconscious 1/27/17 with Catharine Jenkins-Hall, PhD

COURSE DESCRIPTION

The instructor will share lessons she's learned from a 30 year 'hybrid' clinical practice. Working in an acute medical/surgical context, she has married cognitive neuroscience with physiological psychology and psychoanalysis. Clinical material from the treatment of a patient who sustained a severe traumatic brain injury will be presented. It highlights the importance of careful analytic listening, especially when the speaker is unable to formulate complete sentences.

COURSE OBJECTIVES

1. Draw lessons from Leonardo Da Vinci, especially with regard to remaining relentlessly curious without foreclosure and seeking knowledge for its own sake.
2. Articulate how cognitive neuroscience and metapsychology are 2 views of the same effort to describe the functional architecture of the mental apparatus.
3. Analyze the mind as a story-making machine, with Freud's concepts of condensation and displacement as equivalent to Lacan's use of the poetic concepts of metaphor and metonymy.

ABOUT THE INSTRUCTOR

In addition to a private practice in Mission Viejo, Catharine Jenkins-Hall, PhD, has served as a clinical neuropsychologist at Mission Hospital for the last 25 years. There she collaborates with multiple medical disciplines to create interdisciplinary treatment plans. Over the past 30 years, Dr. Jenkins-Hall has evaluated &/or treated an estimated 20,000 cases of neurological disease &/or trauma, each at a different point of recovery.
